ISDH: Home Health Aide (HHA) Registration Program

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After a physician prescribes a home health plan of care, the HHA assesses the patient's condition and likely skilled nursing care, therapy, medical social services and home health aide service needs, at the beginning of the episode of care. The assessment must be done for each subsequent episode of care a patient receives.

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Employment of home health aides and personal care aides is projected to grow 36 percent from 2018 to 2028, much faster than the average for all occupations. As the baby-boom population ages and the elderly population grows, the demand for the services of home health aides and personal care aides will

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continue to increase.
